Meeting Minutes of March 7, 2012

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Wendy LeBlanc, Chair called the meeting to order at 8:02 A.M. Introduction were made by all.

The minutes of the February 1, 2012 were reviewed. A motion to accept the minutes was made by L. Skibba and seconded by P. Murphy. Motion passed.

Presentation: Maureen Ryan, NH Bureau of Housing and Homelessness, presented changes to the Emergency Solution Grant, including information about new money for rapid re-housing and prevention. HUD wants states to collaborate with the Continuum of Care in the planning process of how to utilize the additional funds. She discussed the short turn-around time to plan for the funds and issue an RFP.

Q: Does it have to be one agency that does both the Rapid re housing and prevention or can the agency just do one? A: They would prefer to have one agency do both. Q: Is this new money or will other programs be cut? A: No current funding to shelter programs will be cut. This is additional funding that is being discussed. Q: Have you looked at other states and how they are managing this? A: We did look at Massachusetts but they have a larger amount of funding and they have multiple grants. M. Ryan is going to a conference on Monday and Tuesday to meet with others from all over the country to see what other states are doing.

Announcements: K. Hiza from The NH Food Bank spoke regarding people not having transportation to go to the district office to apply. A web site called NH Easy can be used to apply for Food Stamps and other services provided by the state. She can help people one-on-one doing this application. Posters and handouts were made available.

- P. Kelleher announced that HHI has bought a new permanent housing unit in Clermont NH. Currently they have 8 residents and can take up to 12 people. It's for men and women. The preference is Veterans but will take anyone. Contact Scott Slattery at Harbor Homes.
- T. Lopez reports that the Employment Subcommittee is meeting on April 3rd at 2:00 PM at 12 Amherst St. starting to talk about Project Employment Connect. We are looking for help to get Employers.
- L. Wilshire stated the Block Grant Resolution Planning is meeting tomorrow.
- L. Christie reported that there is a plan to take out the Bronstein apartment. This means 49 Housing units will be taking away which is a big concern for low-income families.
