Meeting Minutes City Hall – Room 208 December 3, 2003 www.nashua-coc.org

- 1. Call to Order: 8:00 am by Chairperson Lisa Christie.
- 2. All present introduced themselves.
- 3. <u>Minutes of the November Meeting:</u> B. Mack moved to accept the minutes of November 5, 2003; P. Kelleher seconded, the motion passed unanimously.
- 4. Executive/Strategic Planning Committee (Lead Entity): K. Nijhuis reported that this committee met on November 26th and is confirming its work on developing guidelines. They had a discussion about CoC's defined purpose, how best to use CoC's meeting time, and improve data gathering for the Super NOFA. The next meeting date was scheduled for January 6th, but now needs to be moved. Notice will be provided to the entire CoC when the new date is set. Minutes of the Lead Entity meetings are available for anyone and will be posted on the CoC website.
- 5. <u>Update Ending Homelessness Committee/Statistics Subcommittee:</u> B. Marks reported that they were currently discussing what data to gather and at what frequency the data is to be gathered. They will meet next on December 14th, 10:00 am, at Harbor Homes.
- 6. <u>HMIS Update:</u> (handout from Lawrence, MA CoC) M. Pendry reported that the contract has just recently been accepted and the money has been appropriated to fund the HMIS program. They will be posting two positions to be filled to work on HMIS paid for with this appropriation. This project is running about six months behind at this point; another survey will be sent to all the agencies in January. Their new goal is to be up running and ready for training by the end of September 2004. M. Pendry will be providing information to the entire CoC on the time and location of training.
- 7. <u>State Interagency Council on the Homeless:</u> (handout) P. Kelleher announced that the Governor has established a Council on Homelessness for New Hampshire. Its membership consists of the Policy Academy members along with Representative Richard Morris of Seabrook.

8. Other:

a. <u>Southern NH Services Senior Housing:</u> N. Lorang reported that the senior housing project has been awarded \$4.3 million. The project will provide 43 units of senior housing and is expected to start in about 18 months. They are ready to go and the project should move quickly.

- b. MP Housing new unit: Sr. Sharon reported that the closing on their new condo unit would be Dec. 12th. They have now housed 20 women and children in these "post-transitional" condos. The first family moved out and became homeowners, another married and moved out, and the rest are fully employed. They are hoping to add 5 more units with the assistance of NHCDFA tax credits.
- c. NH Legal Assistance January Agenda: M. Auer announced that New Hampshire Legal Assistance will be having a training program for people in housing, tenants and landlords, etc. They will be coming to our next CoC meeting to gather questions from the members to be used in making up the training session.
- d. <u>UNH Community Leader of the Year-Congratulations to Peter Kelleher:</u> (handout) L. Christie announced that P. Kelleher was chosen Community Leader of the Year by a group of students in the University of New Hampshire's community development program. He will be presented with the award at a dinner on Dec 4th.
- e. <u>Calendars Interfaith Hospitality:</u> L. Skibba announced that she is selling calendars as a fundraiser for \$10 each. She also provided copies and spoke of an article from the Milford Cabinet about her program and also about the topic of hunger. The article mentioned bringing questions about hunger to the presidential campaign headquarters to be addressed by the various candidates. L. Christie agreed that this would be a good project to pursue and asked L. Skibba to contact M. Yager at the New Hampshire Housing Forum about implementing this idea.
- f. <u>Lori Piper:</u> Announced she has changed jobs and is now working for the Merrimack Savings Bank on Broad Street in Nashua. She will still be working with the CoC as an active participant.
- g. <u>Tavern Hotel:</u> K. Hersh reported that the developer/owner is looking at using this property for mixed income housing. The city will be meeting with the owners again on Dec. 4th.
- 9. Ending Homelessness Committee Full Committee Follow Up: P. Kelleher said that good things were happening at the sub-committee meetings which will start the process moving in a helpful direction to create a plan to end homelessness. M. Pendry, referring to the "Wheel of Responsibility" chart placed on the wall, passed out small cards and asked everyone to fill out the cards and pin them on the wheel or bring them back to the next meeting to place on wheel. It is important to gather all the information as soon as possible to better identify sources of help in the city for homeless people, and to identify the gaps. This information will be incorporated into the plan for ending homelessness.
