- 1. <u>Call to Order:</u> 8:06 am by Chairperson Lisa Christie.
- 2. <u>All present introduced themselves.</u>
- Minutes of the December and January Meetings: B. Marks motioned to accept the December minutes; P Kelleher seconded and the motion was carried. K. Nijhuis motioned to accept the January minutes; R. Morrisette seconded and the motion was carried.
- 4. <u>Gaps Analysis Committee Report:</u> K. Nijhuis reported that this committee met on January 20 and minutes are available to anyone interested (handout). It was decide that the homeless count this year would take place from noon March 30 to noon on March 31. They will be using the same one page form as last year after it has been updated. B. Marks agreed to put the numbers together after the count. P. Kelleher reported that HUD might want a sampling count several times throughout the year in the near future.
- 5. <u>Statistics Subcommittee Report:</u> K. Nijhuis stated that this committee is still gathering data/materials for HIMIS, Emergency Shelters. They have not gotten to prevention or transitional housing yet. He submitted a form (handout) for monthly data counting which will be sent to the agencies. P. Kelleher said it would be helpful for checking progress on the ending homelessness plan on a monthly basis. Once HIMIS is being used, it may show these figures on an ongoing basis. L. Christie said they have decided not to wait for HIMIS to get the information out. K. Nijhuis invited anyone who has a system to share to come to a subcommittee meeting. He will be sending the HUD definition of homelessness to everyone in CoC. M. Auer reported that Vermont was on-line with HIMIS. She said she might be able to get information from them on how well it works. She will e-mail the date of the next NH group meeting on HIMIS to all on the CoC. B. Mack suggested the Data worksheet be posted on the CoC web site. There followed a brief discussion about universal intake of information and how to capture all the homeless people for an accurate count.
- 6. <u>Update on March CoC Retreat:</u> (handouts) K. Nijhuis asked everyone to review and comment on the registration form and brochure as well as the invitation list. He reiterated that this retreat would be the central element to end homelessness in the Nashua area by activating organizations to sign the "Good Neighbor Agreement". D. Lozeau commented that she felt it was wrong to show the film "Home Before Winter" at this retreat because some of the content of the film would be offensive to legislators whom we are hoping to invite. She felt we needed to get to know them personally and invite them to meetings, etc. and include them in discussions and decisions about ending homelessness. K. Nijhuis

said the subcommittee meeting directly after this meeting would discuss the possibility of leaving references to the movie out of their brochure and registration form. P. Kelleher asked for ideas of ways to build bridges with legislators and reminded everyone that affordable housing was really the key to solving the problem.

- 7. <u>Mass Mutual/Harvey Halverson:</u> R. Peterson announced that he has sent an email to all the CoC membership explaining the free life insurance offered by this company to qualifying people of which \$50,000 could be used for education of survivors.
- 8. <u>BOSCOC Report:</u> S. Bultman reported that it was a short meeting, which was mostly about the point-in-time count this year. She said M. Hurb reported that the state would not be doing it this year but may have to begin doing a count 3-4 times a year instead. They have been struggling to get people to attend their meetings. A debriefing is scheduled for the Nashua CoC. N. Lorang reported that he would be retiring from Southern New Hampshire Services at the end of this month by wanted to remind the group that the CoC needs to do more outreach to the homeless that are not in the system and must work together, not in competition with each other. (He will work part time for a while.) M. Auer stated that HUD was making housing its first priority now and service second.
- 9. <u>Other:</u> Heather Tarr is a new employee of Harbor Homes in charge of the Homeless Veteran Program working with the Manchester Veteran's Association.
