Meeting Minutes City Hall – Room 208 January 8, 2003 www.nashua-coc.com

- 1. <u>Call to Order:</u> 8:05 a.m. by Chairperson Lisa Christie.
- 2. All present introduced themselves.
- 3. <u>Minutes of December 4, 2002:</u> Correction was requested under item #11, b. to read, "New Executive Director at Southern NH <u>HIV</u> Task Force is Joyce Keeman". ("HIV" added) Klaas Nijhuis moved to accept as corrected; seconded by Bob Mack. Motion unanimously approved.
- 4. <u>Super NOFA Review:</u> Peter Kelleher thanked everyone who participated for all their help and reported the good news that all our proposed undertakings were being funded for the upcoming year.
- 5. <u>Updating Agencies Page and E-Mail:</u> Lisa brought the request by Miles Pendry for agencies to go to the CoC Web site to review their listings and to send Miles any changes/corrections that should be made. Lisa reminded that there is also a "News and Events" page at the website where an agency's special events can be announced.
- 6. Mayor's Task Force Committee: Bob Mack reported that there has been no meeting this past month, but sub-committees are meeting. A meeting of the whole committee is scheduled for March. Klaas indicated that the Zoning application update is of interest and there will be a Public Hearing on January 23, 2003 where any suggestions regarding bonus density and how it would affect more affordable housing, etc. should be directed to R. Keating.
- 7. <u>EDI Advisory Committee</u>: Klaas Nijhuis reported they would be meeting today (January 8th at 3:30) to discuss an application from Nashua Children's Home for funding towards a five unit transitional housing project. Anyone interested was invited to come.
- 8. Ending Homelessness Committee: Klaas Nijhuis reported the Committee had met last month right after the CoC meeting and that they will be meeting again today (January 8th) immediately following the CoC meeting. They will do SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats) analysis. Peter Kelleher added that his agency with the support of others is working on bringing a representative from the National Coalition to End Homelessness to Nashua to address State/local groups sometime in May 2003 and to help us with our planning effort.
- 9. <u>BOSCOC Meeting:</u> Tony Epaphras reported they would be meeting January 16, 2003.

- 10. <u>42 Pine Street:</u> Peter Kelleher reported that Aldermen Plamondon had been called about three groups who were interested in the space. He is waiting for a call back to arrange a walk-through, which would occur perhaps in April.
- 11. <u>Data Gathering Committee:</u> Wendy Buice announced that they would be meeting today following the full CoC meeting (later changed to Monday, January 13th) and that the committee would have to pick a new chairperson as she would be moving away from the area before the next meeting.
- 12. <u>Marguerite's Place Award:</u> Lisa Christie reported that the Community Development Finance Authority had awarded M.P. Housing \$500,000 in Tax Credits. Congratulations to Sr. Sharon and staff.
- 13. Technical Assistance/TAC: Peter Kelleher and Nick Lorang reported on the discussions with the State Homeless Office, TAC (Technical Assistance Collaborative) and HUD. David Dustin has been e-mailed with a request on clarifying the process for obtaining funding for technical assistance in our annual grant application. Nick talked with Lance dePlante. We are awaiting a reply (expected before the next CoC meeting) in response to a letter written to HUD about obtaining consultant help with technical assistance for the Super NOFA submission. HUD is expected to provide us a list of consultants to pick from. As to sharing Balance of State funds for submission preparation, it was reported that Lance dePlante was encouraging the Greater Nashua CoC to join the Balance of State to get access to funds. This resulted in a discussion about our Continuum's history and successes. The Nashua CoC started in 1996 (two years before Balance of State) and is the largest, most active group and has generated more HUD monies than the other Continuums. Nashua has always been independent of the Balance of State, representing the local community.

14. Other:

- a. <u>Proposal Reviews by CoC:</u> Mary Moriarty of St. John Newman's medication program asked if others could confirm that there is a new process (using the Balance of State) for reviewing McKinney funded project proposals. Lisa said she has not yet heard anything.
- b. Section 8: Sue Mead/CCN mentioned that the HUD funding bill currently in Congress is proposed to be amended in a way that will adversely impact Section 8. Congress is concerned about the number of vouchers not being placed and is proposing a reduction in the number of vouchers to match the number actually placed. This is believed to have an affect that will also be felt in NH. She will keep CoC informed.
- c. <u>Search for Sites for Development as Affordable Housing:</u> David Cull/SPPM reminded everyone that he is still looking for any possible property. He will talk with Klaas Nijhuis.
- d. <u>Empty Bowls:</u> Lisa Christie/NSK&S reported that the Empty Bowls fundraiser will be February 5, 2003 at the new high School from 6:00-8:00 pm. There will be an open house pottery-making event on January 16, 2003, at 2:30, at the new high school. Contact Robin Perringer by e-mail peringer@charter.net if interested.

- e. <u>811 Grant:</u> Peter announced that Harbor Homes is working on purchasing five condominium units in the Nashua area with monies from this HUD grant.
