Meeting Minutes Room 208, City Hall September 8, 2004 www.nashua-coc.org

- 1. Call to Order: 8:03 a.m. by Chairperson Lisa Christie.
- 2. All present introduced themselves.
- 3. <u>Minutes of May 5th, June 3rd, and June 23, 2004:</u> Maryse Wirbal motioned the minutes be accepted; Mary Moriarty seconded and the motion carried.
- 4. September 17th Unveiling of the GNCOC's Ten Year Plan to End Homelessness: B. Mack reported that the unveiling would take place at 9:00 am in Greeley Park. The invited speakers will be Ignatius Maclellen of FannieMae and the State Interagency Council, Mayor Bernard A. Streeter of Nashua, Governor Craig Benson, and Philip Mangano, Interagency Council on Homelessness. The Ending Homelessness subcommittee will be meeting at 9:00 am today (Sept. 8th) to develop the details of the program. P. Kelleher thanked B. Mack for all the hard work that he and several others have put into developing this Plan. L. Christie encouraged everyone to invite people from their agencies to attend the unveiling.
- 5. <u>Section 8 Crisis Response Update:</u> L. Christie said letters were sent out to all the legislators and some responses have been received. She will have them posted on the CoC website for all to read. G. Hicks-Grogan announced that Fair Market Rents (FMR) have been released but, for the first time, Nashua and Manchester have been combined. Because rents are lower in Manchester, this will not work well for Nashua. She has appealed to HUD and suggests others do so. She will email CoC members with a sample letter to use for this purpose today.
- 6. <u>HMIS Report Update:</u> M. Pendry reported that PC's have been delivered to local shelters and they will be setting up training sessions soon. Later PC's will be given to transitional housing agencies and then to the service provider agencies last. Community Services Council of New Hampshire (CSCNH) will have challenges with the training around what information to input and what can be shared or not with other agencies until the various departments of the federal government move toward standardization.
- 7. Process for Continuum Business: The Lead Entity committee will schedule a meeting before the next CoC meeting to set up a slate of officers for the election.

 L. Christie will e-mail the members to decide on a date for this meeting. K.

 Nijhuis announced that he has put in an application for an intern from the graduate students at Southern New Hampshire University who will work with the CoC to help develop a process for Continuum business over the next 16 months.

8. Other:

- a. <u>Keystone Hall</u>'s New Intensive Outpatient Program: K. Kelley passed out flyers about this program which will consist of four 3-hour sessions a week for four weeks, Monday through Thursday from 8:30 am to 11:30 am at Keystone Hall, Pine Street Extension, Nashua and will include relapse prevention and recovery, anger management and assertiveness, stress and craving management, and relationship and family issues.
- b. EDI Housing Advisory Meeting to consider funding requests: K. Nijhuis reported that there were three proposals submitted for consideration to the EDI Housing Advisory committee which will meet on Monday, September 20, 2004 in Room 208 of the Nashua City Hall. They will be meeting, probably for the last time, since these projects will exhaust the funds for now. The proposals received were from MP Housing Inc. for condominium purchase, Southern New Hampshire Services Inc. for Elderly Housing units, and Harbor Homes Inc. for homeless veterans individuals/ families.
- c. Veterans Transitional Program/Harbor Homes, Inc.: H. Tarr thanked the CoC for their support in helping to open a 20 unit transitional housing facility for single homeless veterans on Amherst Street in Nashua. The first resident moved in January 2004, and they now have 18 residents and are accepting applications for the two remaining openings. P. Kelleher announced the new veteran housing project under development is proposed to be at Railroad Square in Nashua.
- d. <u>Upper Room Ministries</u>: K. Petrini passed out flyers announcing their move from Elm Street, Nashua to 36 Tolles Street, Nashua. They will have an open house on Saturday, October 23rd. from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm; everyone is invited to attend.
- e. World AIDS Day Celebration: W. Furnari announced they would be celebrating World AIDS Day on December 1, 2004 and invited any agency that would like to participate in this event to contact her by phone at 595-8464 x 15. The theme this year will be emphasizing women with AIDS. Their next meeting is on Tuesday, September 21, 2004 at the Task Force facility.
- f. Tenth Annual Northeast Housing Network Conference: K. Nijhuis passed out a flyer announcing the conference which is on Wednesday, September 22, 2004 at the Sheraton Nashua Hotel from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm. It is organized by six housing coalitions from the six New England States; the cost is \$70 to attend.
- g. Start of five-year <u>Consolidated Plan Process</u>: K. Nijhuis explained that this is the plan that guides the HUD, CDBG, and HOME money which goes toward housing and other projects benefiting low- and moderate-income people. CoC members should expect their agencies to be contacted and interviewed over the next two months, and public meetings with focus group discussions are expected to start in three to four months. The completion date is scheduled for May 15, 2005.

- h. <u>Anniversary Celebrations</u>: D. Lozeau announced the <u>Community Action Program</u> celebrated its 40th year in June. M. Brown announced that <u>SHARE</u> in Milford was celebrating its 25th year and Sr. S. Walsh announced that <u>Marguerite's Place</u> was celebrating its 10th year.
- i. <u>The Dental Connection</u>: M. Wirbal announced that the Dental Connection was going very well and they are now able to take emergency appointments with the waiting list for others under six weeks. They will be having an open house soon. She will post it on the website.
- j. <u>CoC website</u>: L. Christie reminded everyone to e-mail announcements for the CoC website to Miles Pendry at Harbor Homes at m.Pendry@harborhomes.org.
- 9. Next Meeting: The next meeting will be October 6, 2004 in Room 208, Nashua City Hall.
